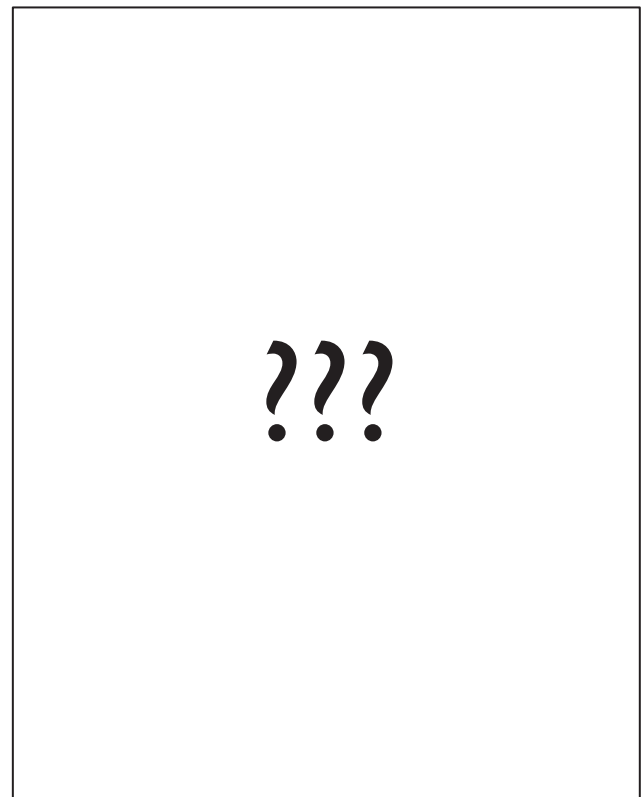
Pattern Basics

- All instructions use a 1/4" seam allowance unless otherwise stated.
- All fabrics are sewn right sides together, unless otherwise stated.

Common Quilting Acronyms:

FQ = fat quarter (18" x 22")	WS = wrong side of fabric
WOFQ = width of fat quarter	RS = right side of fabric
WOF = width of fabric	HST = half square triangle
LOF = length of fabric	QST = quarter square triangle



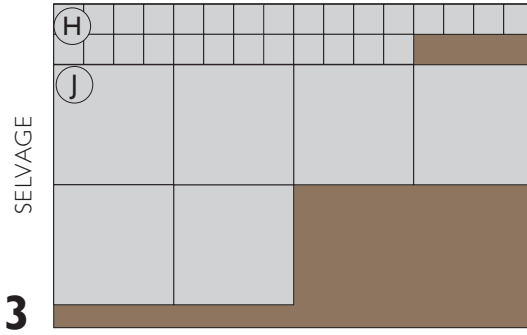
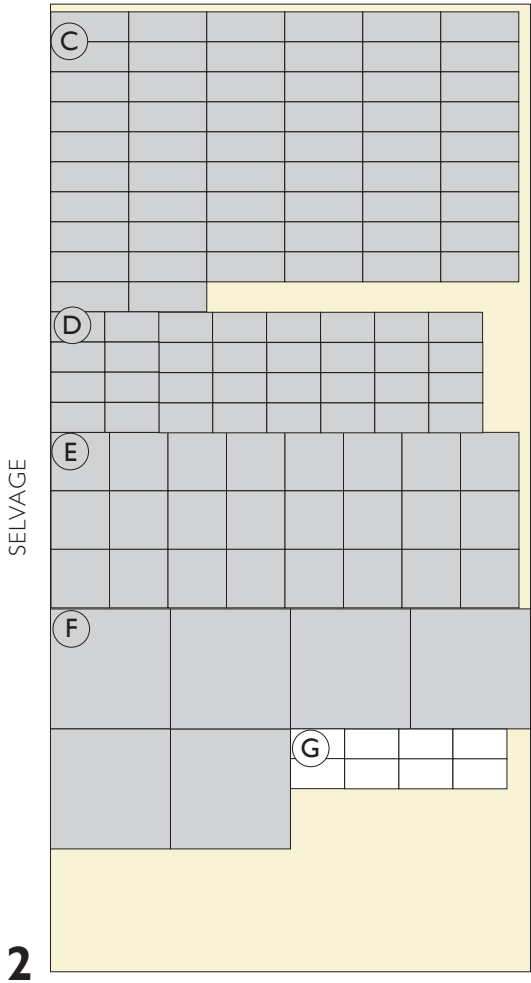
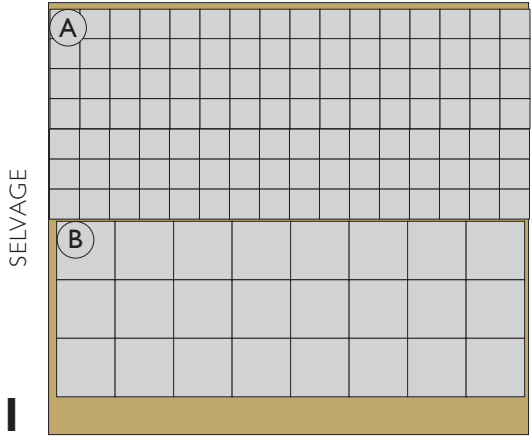

Fussy Cut



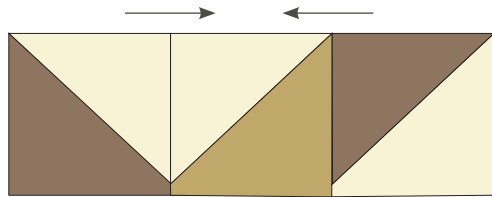

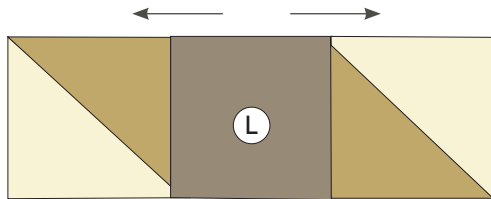
Block A Assembly:

10. Sew a Part 2, Step 6 HST on each side of a Part 1, Step 5 HST as shown. Press.



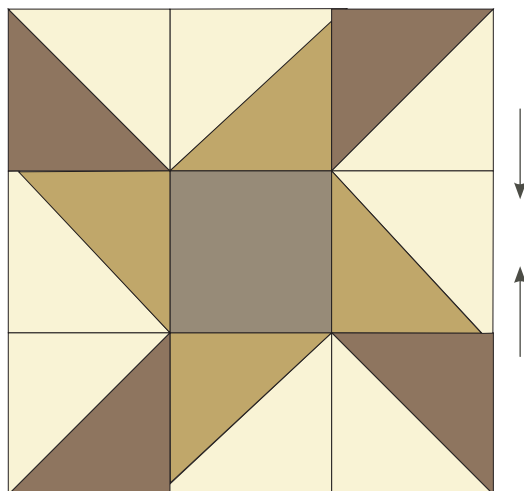
Make 12 ~ 4-1/2" x 12-1/2"

11. Sew a Part 1, Step 5 HST on each side of an L as shown. Press.



Make 6 ~ 4-1/2" x 12-1/2"

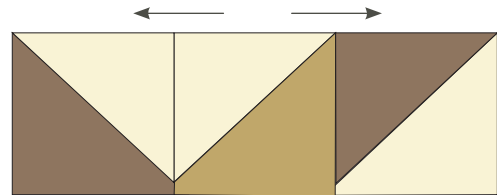
12. Sew a Step 10 unit on the top and bottom of a Step 11 unit as shown. Press.



Make 6 ~ 12-1/2" square

Block B Assembly:

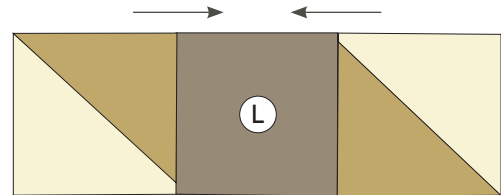
13. Sew a Part 2, Step 6 HST on each side of a Part 1, Step 5 HST as shown. Press.



Make 12 ~ 4-1/2" x 12-1/2"

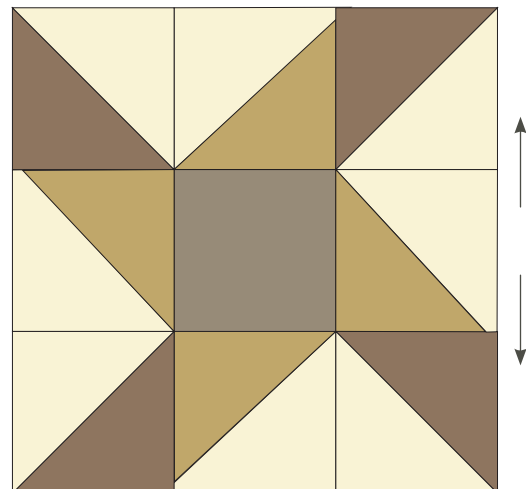
Note: Block A and Block B are constructed exactly the same except the seams between the units are pressed in the opposite directions, so seams will nest when the blocks are joined.

14. Sew a Part 2, Step 5 HST on each side of an L as shown. Press.



Make 6 ~ 4-1/2" x 12-1/2"

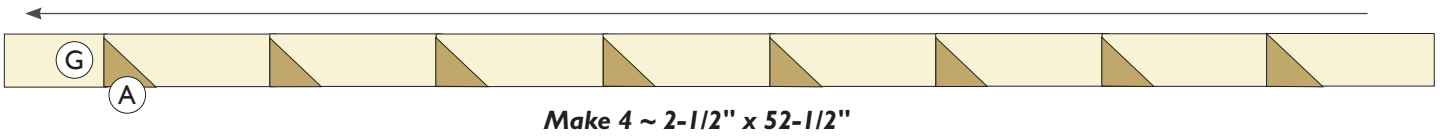
15. Sew a Step 13 unit on the top and bottom of a Step 14 unit as shown. Press.



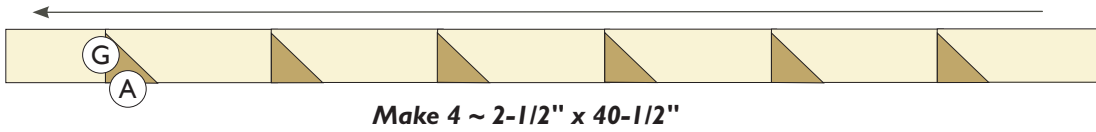
Make 6 ~ 12-1/2" square

Border Assembly:

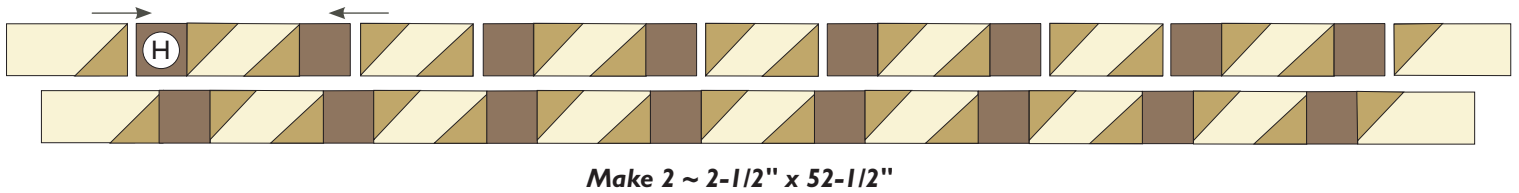
16. Sew eight Part I, Step 1 units together in a row as shown. Press. Sew a **G** to the end with an **A**. Press.



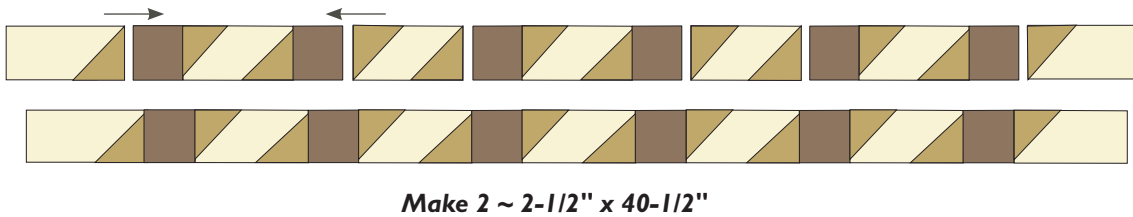
17. Sew six Part I, Step 1 units together in a row as shown. Press. Sew a **G** to the end with an **A**. Press.



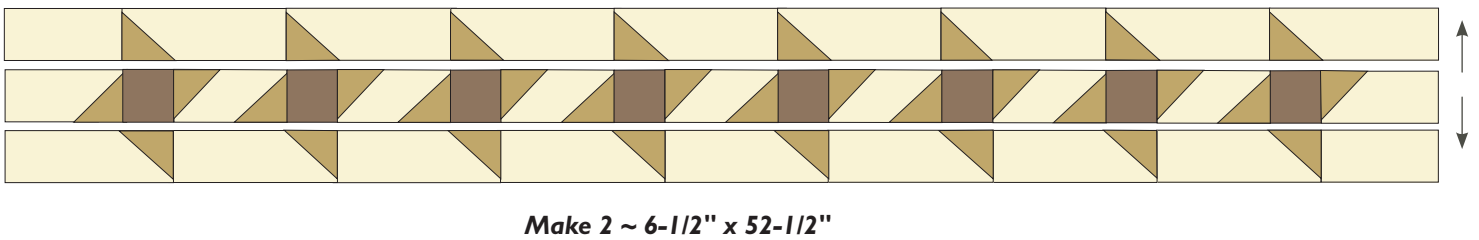
18. Sew four Part I, Step 4 units alternating with three Part I, Step 3 units. Sew a Part I, Step 2 unit on each end as shown. Press to the **Hs**.



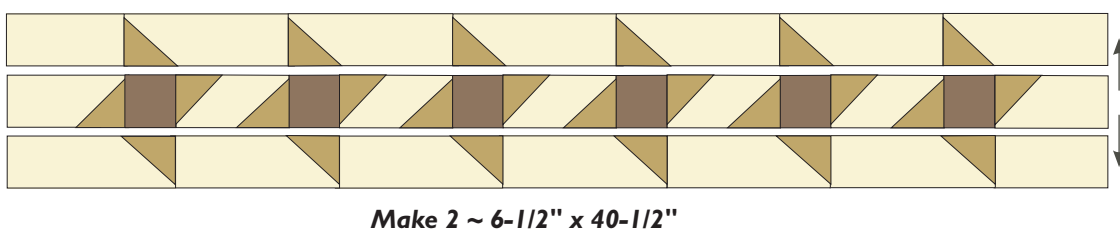
19. Sew three Part I, Step 4 units alternating with two Part I, Step 3 units. Sew a Part I, Step 2 unit on each end as shown. Press to the **Hs**.



20. Sew a Step 16 row on the top and bottom of a Step 18 row. Press.

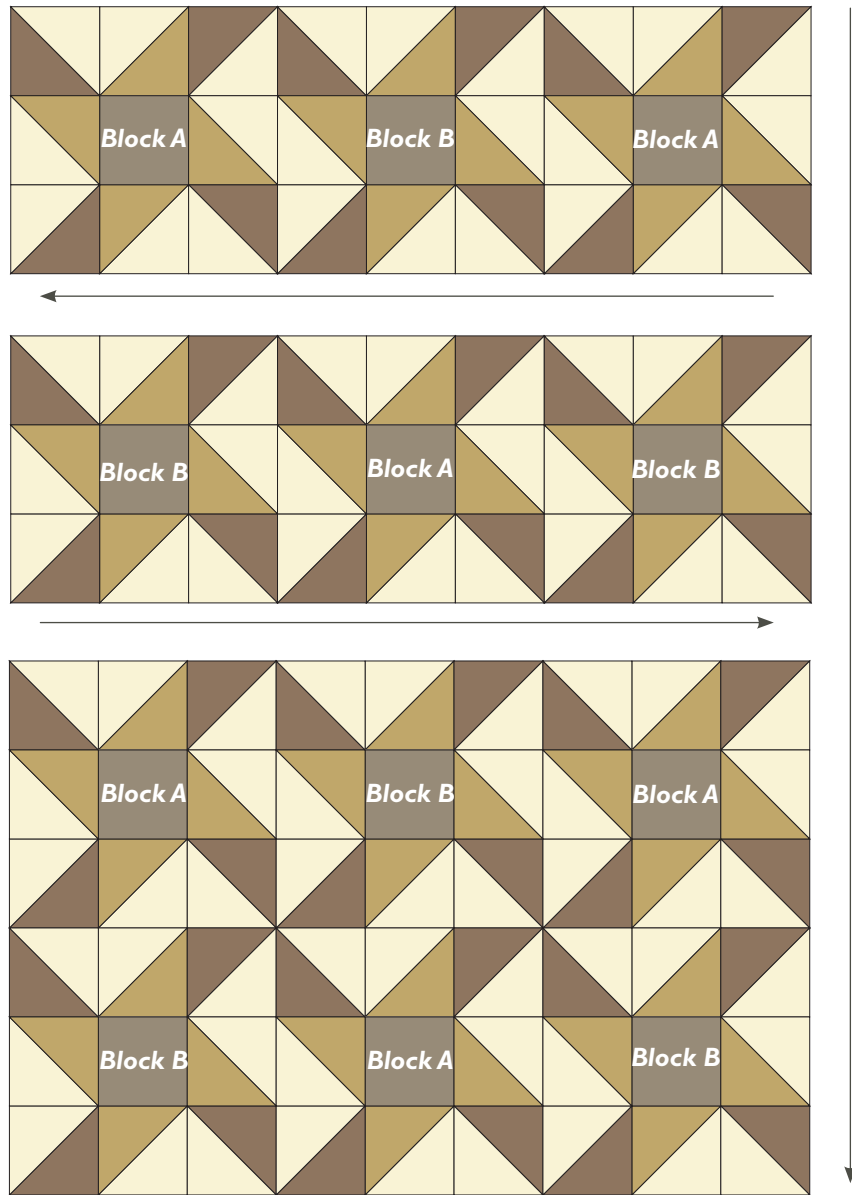


21. Sew a Step 17 row on the top and bottom of a Step 19 row. Press.



Quilt Body Assembly:

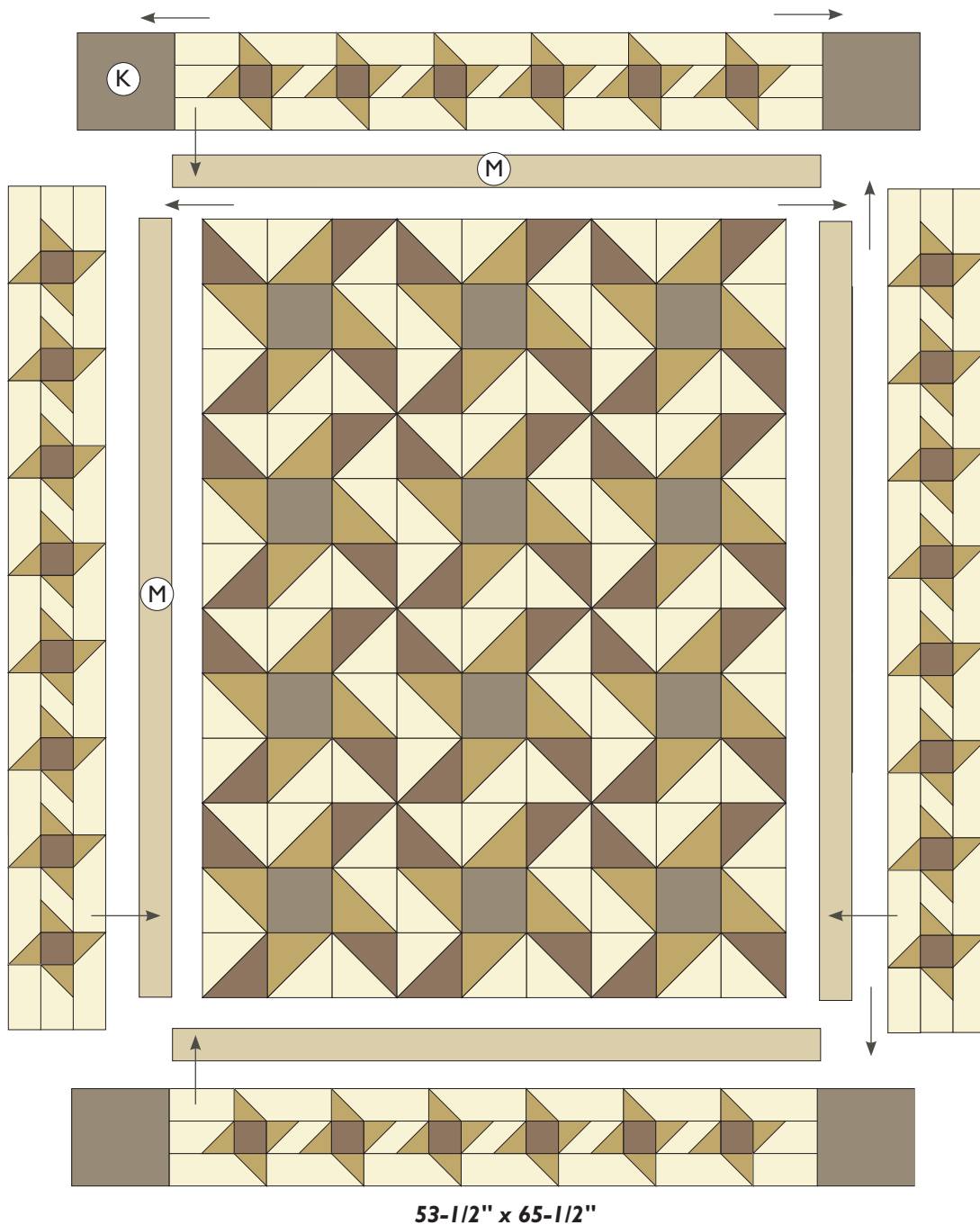
22. Sew four rows of three blocks, alternating Block A and Block B, so seams will nest. Press.
23. Sew the rows together. Press.

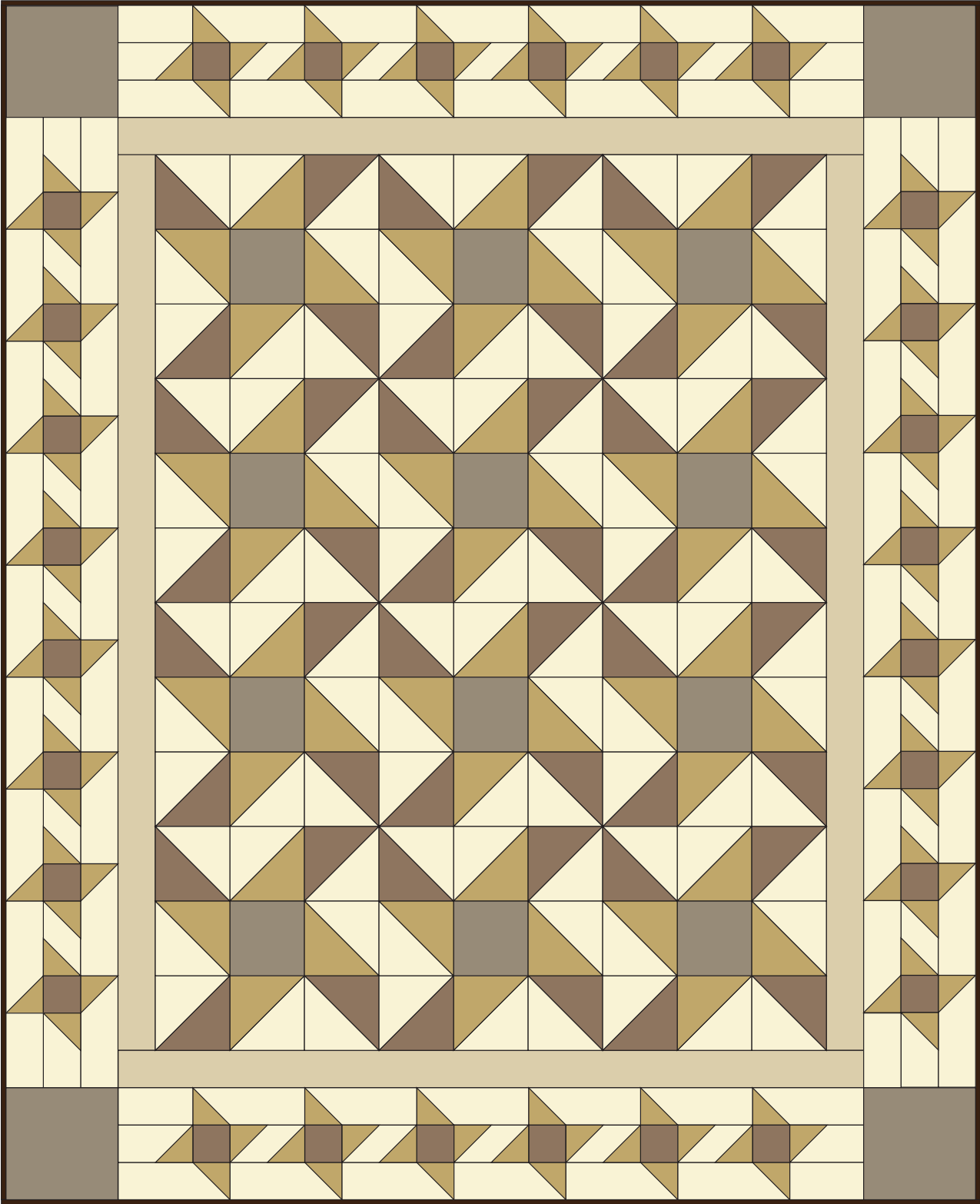
Add the Borders:

24. Measure the length of the quilt through the center, cut two pieced **M**s to that measurement (about 48-1/2"), and sew to the sides. Press.
25. Measure the width of the quilt, cut two **M**s to that measurement (about 40-1/2"), and sew to the top and bottom. Press.
26. Measure the quilt across the width of the quilt. If the pieced border from Step 21 is a little too long, fold in half across the width and trim it to the measurement of the width (about 40-1/2"). Sew a **K** on each end. Press. Do not sew to quilt yet.
27. Measure the length of the quilt through the center. If the pieced border from Step 20 is a little too long, fold in half across the width and trim it to the measurement of the length (about 48-1/2"). Sew a Step 20 pieced border to each side. Press.
28. Sew a Step 26 pieced border to the top and bottom. Press.



Finish the Quilt:

28. Layer backing WS up, batting, and top WS down. Quilt. Bind with a 1/4" seam allowance.
