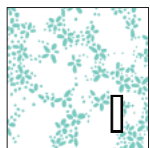

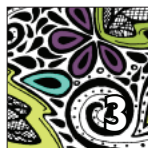

Pattern Basics

We encourage breaking the rules, but here are a few things you might want to keep in mind:







- Please read through **all** the instructions carefully **before** beginning a project. Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of this pattern.
- All instructions use a 1/4" seam allowance unless otherwise stated.
- All fabrics are sewn right sides together; unless otherwise stated.

Common Quilting Acronyms:

FQ = fat quarter (18" x 22") WS = wrong side of fabric
WOFQ = width of fat quarter RS = right side of fabric
WOF = width of fabric HST = half square triangle
LOF = length of fabric QST = quarter square triangle

Approx. finished size: 57-1/2" x 69-1/2"

 1 yd	 1/2 yd	 3/4 yd
 3/4 yd	 1-1/4 yds	 2 yds

A - Four 3-1/2" x 6-1/2"
B - Twenty-six 4-3/4" sqs
C - Seven 7-1/4" sqs

F - One 7-1/4" sq **cut** twice diagonally
G - Twenty-eight 3-7/8" sqs

D - Three 7-1/4" sqs **cut** twice diagonally

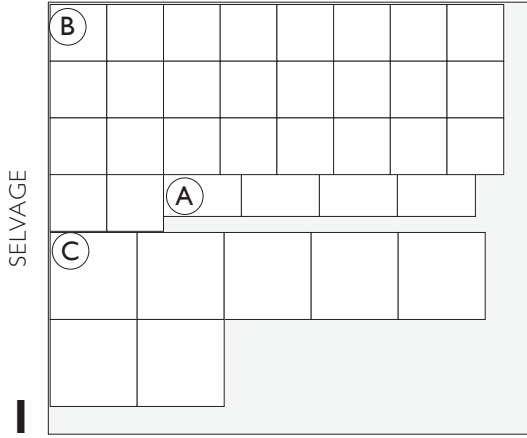
H - One 14" sq **cut** twice diagonally
J - Eight 4" sqs **cut** once diagonally

Note: Only the pieces needed for Part 1 are shown; other pieces will be revealed in Parts 2 & 3.

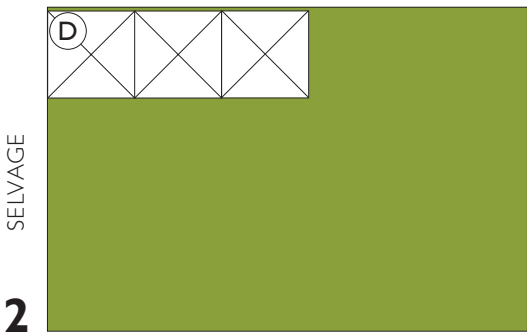
Cutting Suggestions

Yardage below is diagrammed on 40" width selvage to selvage. FQs are diagrammed on 20" width.

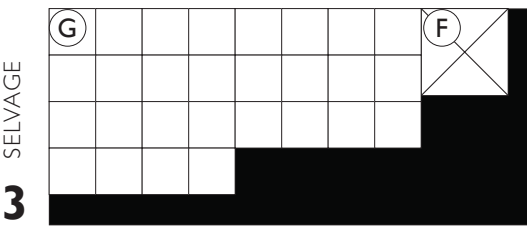
Note: Carefully follow cutting layout as shown to leave room for pieces that will need to be cut in Parts 2 & 3. Do not cut WOF strips unless directed; this may not leave enough fabric for later use.



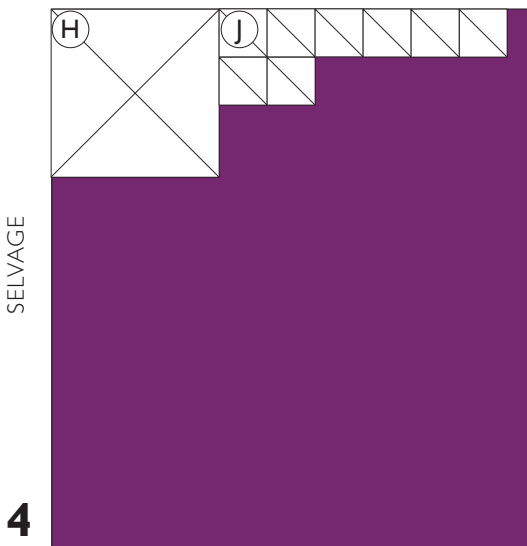

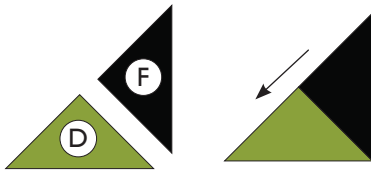
Mystery Block Assembly:

1. Sew a **B** to a **D** as shown. Press in the direction of the arrow.



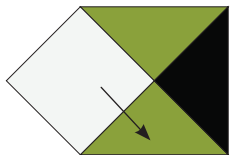
Make 4

2. Sew a **D** to an **F** as shown. Press.



Make 4

3. Sew a Step 1 unit to a Step 2 unit. Press.



Make 4

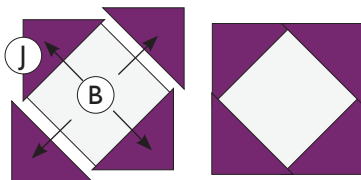
4. Sew a Step 3 unit to an **A**. Press.



Make 4

Diamond in a Square Assembly:

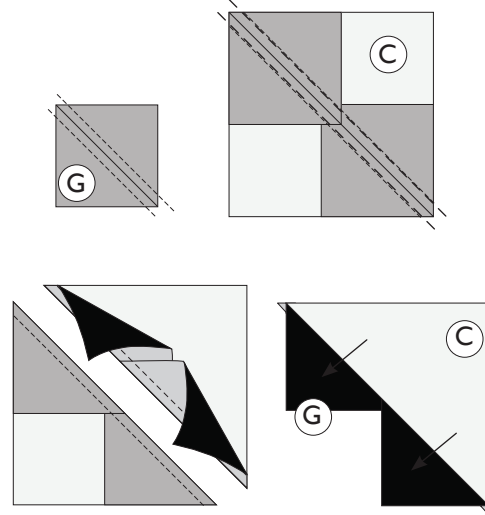
5. Center and sew a **J** on opposite sides of a **B** using a scant 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Sew a **J** on the remaining sides. Press. *Hint: The Js are slightly larger than needed. Square-up units to 6-1/2" leaving 1/4" seam allowances.*

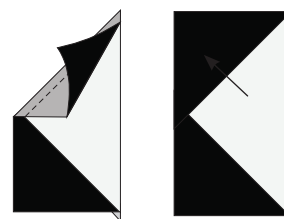
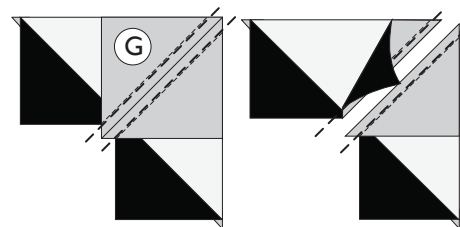
Flying Geese Assembly:

6. Draw a diagonal line on the WS of all **G**s. Draw a 1/4" line to each side of the center line. Lay two **G**s in the opposite corners of a **C**. Sew slightly to the center of the 1/4" (dashed) line and cut on the center line (solid). Press **G**s away from **C**.



7. Lay a **G** in the corner of the **C**. Sew slightly to the center of the 1/4" (dashed) line and cut on the center (solid) line. Press **G**s away from **C**.

Note: Each process will result in four Flying Geese units. Use the remaining **C**s and **G**s to make a total of 28 Flying Geese units.



Make 28
3-1/2" x 6-1/2"

Next Part:

8. Set aside the unused **B**s, **D**s and **H**s for later use.
