






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Pattern Basics

We encourage breaking the rules, but here are a few things you might want to keep in mind:







- Please read through **all** the instructions carefully **before** beginning a project. Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of this pattern.
- All instructions use a 1/4" seam allowance unless otherwise stated.
- All fabrics are sewn right sides together, unless otherwise stated.

Common Quilting Acronyms:

FQ = fat quarter (18" x 22") WS = wrong side of fabric
 WOFQ = width of fat quarter RS = right side of fabric
 WOF = width of fabric HST = half square triangle
 LOF = length of fabric QST = quarter square triangle

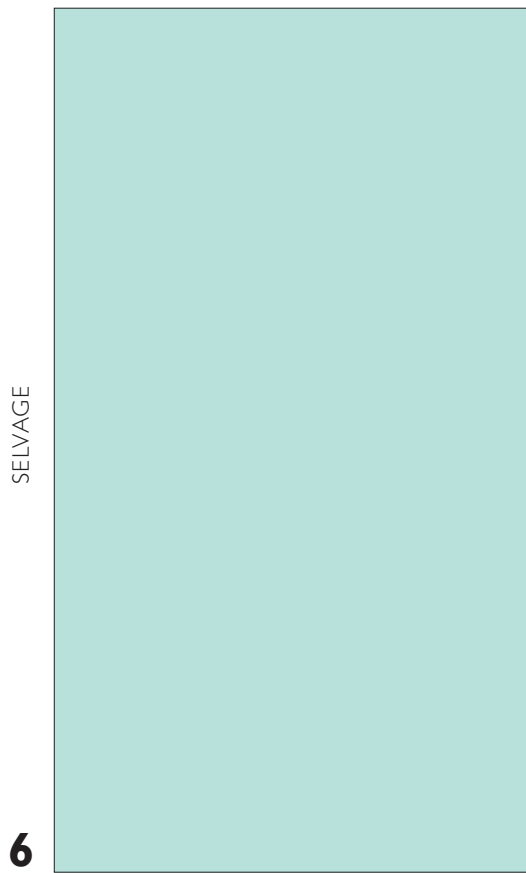
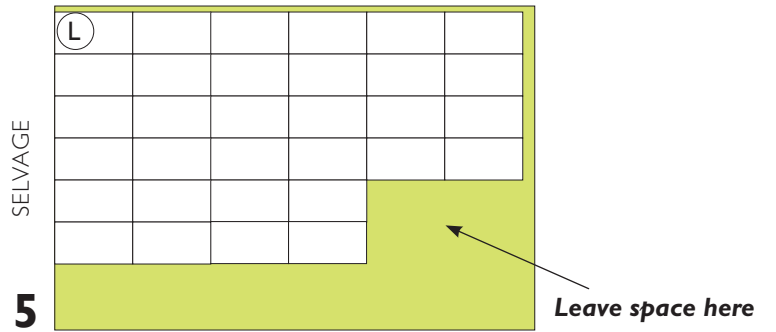
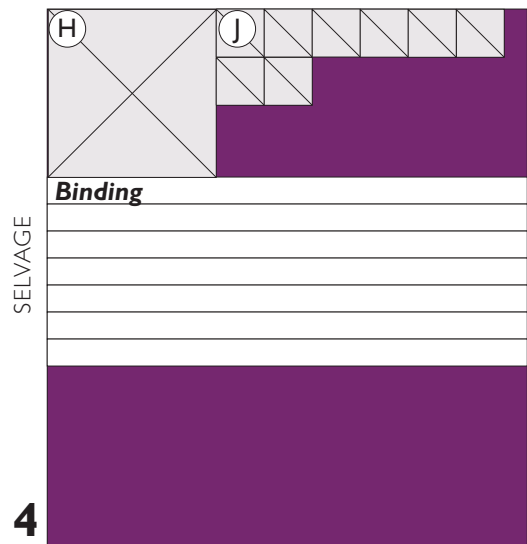
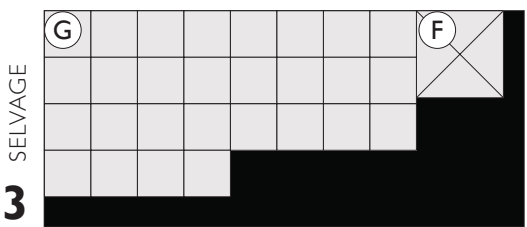
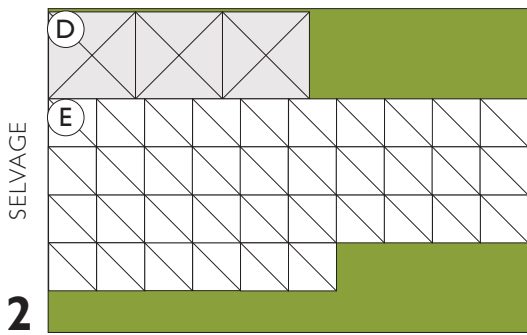
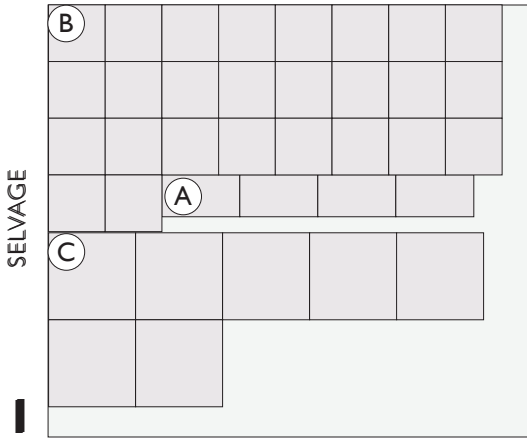
 <p>1</p> <p>A - Four 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" B - Twenty-six 4-1/2" sqs C - Seven 7-1/4" sqs</p> <p>1 yd</p>	 <p>3</p> <p>F - One 7-1/4" sq cut twice diagonally G - Twenty-eight 3-7/8" sqs</p> <p>1/2 yd</p>	 <p>5</p> <p>L - Thirty-two 3-1/2" x 6-1/2"</p> <p>3/4 yd</p>
 <p>2</p> <p>D - Three 7-1/4" sqs cut twice diagonally E - Thirty-two 4" sqs cut once diagonally</p> <p>3/4 yd</p>	 <p>4</p> <p>H - One 14" sq cut twice diagonally J - Eight 4" sqs cut once diagonally Binding - at least 264" of a continuous 2-1/4" strip</p> <p>1-1/4 yds</p>	 <p>6</p> <p>2 yds</p>

Yardage below is diagrammed on 40" width selvage to selvage. FQs are diagrammed on 20" width.

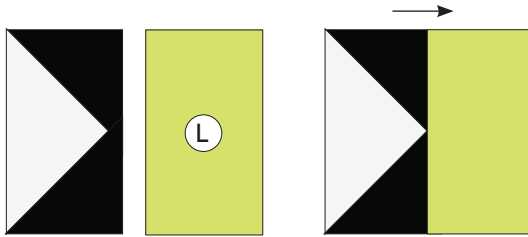

Directions

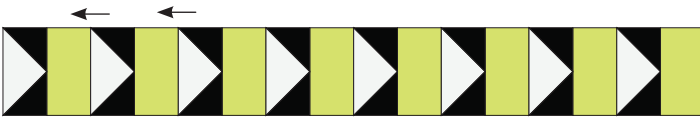
More Mystery Units Assembly:

9. Sew an **L** to a Step 7 Flying Geese unit as shown. Press. Set aside remaining **Ls**.



Make 28
6-1/2" square

10. Sew eight Step 9 units in a row. Press.



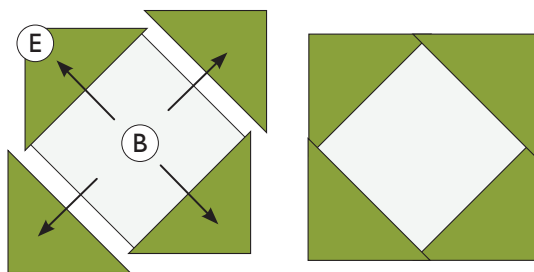
Make 2
6-1/2" x 48-1/2"

11. Sew six Step 9 units in a row. Press.



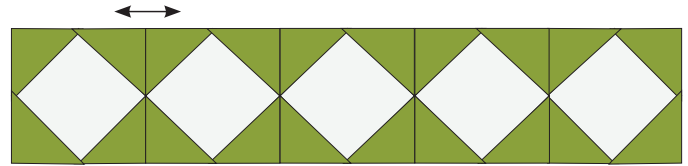
Make 2
6-1/2" x 36-1/2"

12. Repeating the Step 5 process from Part I, center and sew an **E** on opposite sides of a **B** using a scant 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Sew an **E** on the remaining sides. Press. *Hint: The **Es** are slightly larger than needed. Square-up units to 6-1/2" leaving 1/4" seam allowances.*



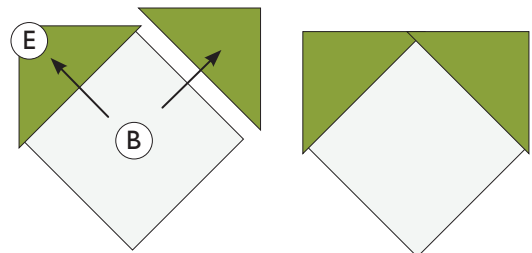
Make 14
6-1/2" square

13. Sew two rows of five Step 12 units. Press seams open. Set aside the four unused units.



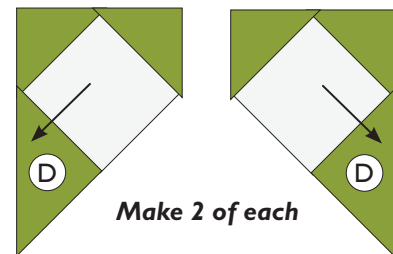
Make 2 ~ 6-1/2" x 30-1/2"

14. Sew an **E** on the upper left corner of a **B** using a scant 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Sew an **E** on the upper right corner. Press. Since the **Es** are slightly larger than needed, use the bottom point of **B** and the vertical 3-1/4" marks on a ruler as guides to square-up the unit to 6-1/2" leaving 1/4" seam allowances.



Make 4

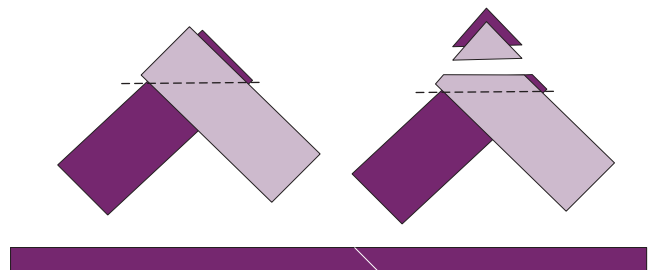
15. Sew a **D**, oriented as shown, to the lower left side of a Step 14 unit. Press. Repeat to sew a **D** on the lower right edge.



Make 2 of each

Make Binding:

16. Sew the Binding strips end-to-end with a diagonal seam. Press seams open. Press in half along the length.



Next Part:

17. Set aside unused **Hs** and **Ls** for later use.
